History station

A 7-year-old female patient presented with a history of headache of 2 months duration.

Patient has a history of one tonic-clonic seizure.

On physical examination, patient was found to have bilateral papilledema.

- 1- Ask the patient about her headache. (3 questions)
- 2- Identify the MRI sequences.
- 3- Suspected diagnosis? Location of lesion?
- 4- Classification used?
- 5- What's the clinical significance of papilledema?

Physical exam station

Patient presented to the ED with a history of head trauma.

- 1- What's her GCS?
- 2- What category of head injury does it fall under?
- 3- Ask her about her symptoms. (4 questions)
- 4- What's the best investigation tool?
